Year 9 Content Overview, Term 3, 2020

| Subject Name | Description | Assessments |
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| ENGLISH | Close Study of Shakespeare (Romeo & Juliet) then The Power of Protest (poetry/songs) | Analytical Essay - Week 5 |
| MATHEMATICS | Students will be working on different units based on the course of Mathematics they are studying. Full details are given in the Scope and Sequences by course available on the school website. Key topics being studied by most students are Linear Relationships, Rates, Algebra and Indices, with Simultaneous Equations and Quadratics beginning to be introduced in the higher-level courses. | Students will be completing an assignment based on content covered during the term. |
| SCIENCE | Students will be studying a topic called "Walking Lightly on the Earth". Students will explore how the Earth is changing and the consequences for life on Earth with. | Skills, knowledge & understanding task. Some outcomes will be from the last topic and the current one being studied. |
| PDHPE | Health Unit 2 - Relationships, covering the topics of Sexual Relationships, Inclusiveness, Positive Relationships and Abusive Relationships. PE Units - Winter Team Sports | Equality Campaign Task |
| COMMERCE | Law, Society, Political involvement. Students will develop an understanding of how laws affect individuals and groups and regulate society, and how individuals and groups participate in the democratic process. To assess their understanding and skills in research and literacy, students will research a contemporary social and legal issue to produce a news article. | Ongoing class activities, homework and research task. |
| GEOGRAPHY | 9 HSIE 2, 4, 6, 8 Students will be studying Sustainable Biomes. They will continue developing their geographical research skills. | Ongoing homework and research task. See assessment guidelines which will be distributed to Year 9 classes. |
| HISTORY | 9HSIE 1, 3, 5, 7 Australia- Making a Nation. Migration and Industrialisation are areas that will be explored within this context. | Ongoing Homework activities, topic tests and research task |

| ELECTIVE HISTORY | Students will be studying Ancient Rome- examining | Ongoing class activities , |

| INTECH ENGINEERING/ ISTEM | During Semester 2 all iSTEM students will complete their "Rockets" design challenge and report. Their next project involves designing and constructing an electric car as part of a unit on Machines and Mechanism. The order in which the various iSTEM classes complete these units of work across the semester may vary due to rooming restrictions. | During term 3 student will complete two assessment tasks: Task 1- the design, construction, testing of a solid state rocket. This task will be accompanied by an evaluation report. Task 2: Electric car design, development, testing and evaluation |
| INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY: WOOD | During Semester 2 students in InTech Wood will be continuing the design and construction of a Spice Rack and Foot-Stool. In these projects students will learn the use of jigs, routing processes, widening joints and through housings, laser cutting and finishing techniques. Students will then be building on their Semester 1 skills by completing an advanced project, using portable power tools, cabinet-making and wood-turning techniques. | Practical: Spice Rack, Foot Stool, and Advanced Project Assignment: During Term 3 students will complete an assignment on careers in the timber industry. Examination: Yearly examination to be held in Term 4 |
| DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY: JEWELLERY | During Term 3 the students in Jewellery will use their understanding of processes and agency, developed during the first semester, to continue designing and making pieces in both base metals and sterling silver. They will also undertake new processes in mold-making, pewter casting, chain-making and saw-piercing taught this Term to both advance their design abilities and create more advanced jewellery pieces. | Students are assessed on: 3 mandatory projects made in class: Progress towards making an advanced project, utilizing the skill covered in class and; The continuing progress of their design portfolios, to be produced both in class and as homework. |
| GRAPHICS TECHNOLOGY | In Graphics Technology students will be working in Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop to create a political stencil. They will then further develop skills in CAD based drawing using Fusion 360, with the focus around Architectural design. | During Term 3 students will create a political stencil and start working on an Architectural Design Project. |
| FOOD TECHNOLOGY | Students will be commencing a unit entitled Food in Australia. This will include an overview of Indigenous Native foods and the historical development of our multicultural cuisines. | In class tasks Weekly practical lessons |
