Year 7 Content Overview, Term 3, 2021

Subject name	Description	Assessments*
ENGLISH	Close study of a Novel (<i>Holes/Nevernoor</i>)	Written Response Week 8
MATHEMATICS	Students will continue studying Understanding Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, before moving into Measurement and Decimals, Computation with Fractions and Measurement with Circles.	Students will be completing an assignment covering the content from the term.
SCIENCE	Students will study a topic called Our World. Our ideas about Earth and Space have changed over time. Understanding the structure of Earth and the materials it is made of lets us develop new knowledge about the history of our planet. Technologies have allowed us to better understand how the solar system behaves. Students will be learning about: Earth's structure and rocks; fossils and their significance; the solar system (past and present understandings) and related phenomena.	Proposed assessment this term will be based around a series of smaller online tests focussing on skills and some knowledge.
GEOGRAPHY	Students will be examining Landscapes and Landforms this term. They will learn how to gather, analyse and present geographical data and information. Classes: R, U, P	Ongoing homework and a research task. Assessment guidelines will be distributed to Year 7 classes.
HISTORY	Students will be investigating the Ancient Past, the Mediterranean world- Egypt. They will be developing skills in comprehension, writing and speaking while researching, interpreting and analysing historical information Classes: T, I, M, H	Ongoing homework and/or research task-World Heritage Site Assessment schedule will be distributed to Year 7 classes.

<p>TECHNOLOGY – Industrial Arts</p>	<p>At the end of Term 2 Year 7 Technology students began their second rotation. They left the Home Economics Faculty and are now in the Industrial Arts Faculty and will be continuing there for the rest of the semester.</p> <p>In Industrial Arts, students will be given the opportunity to design, experiment and test basic Engineering principles in the construction of a Bottle Car Racer.</p> <p>From week 6, students will then focus on developing their skills in the Timber Materials unit with the design and construction of a device holder.</p>	<p>Bottle Trap Car Racer design and testing day challenge - Due week 5</p> <p>Design and construction of a timber-based device holder</p>
<p>TECHNOLOGY – Home Economics</p>	<p>At the end of Term 2 Year 7 Technology students began their second rotation. They left the Industrial Arts Faculty and are now in the Home Economics Faculty and will be continuing there for the rest of the semester.</p> <p>Home Economics, students will be given the opportunity to experience both Food Technology and Textiles Technology.</p> <p>Food Technology will focus on students researching and developing food from the “Farm to the Fork”. They will produce a Noodle Box within set parameters.</p> <p>When students are participating in a practical lesson they are required to bring to class a dishcloth, teatowel and a container for their food. A plastic bag for the wet tea towels and dishcloths to be placed in after the lesson is recommended.</p> <p>In Textiles Technology, students will be developing a handcrafted textile memory. They will produce a tie dyed and embroidered cushion using brightly coloured dyes onto calico.</p> <p>Students are required to purchase their own fabric or it can be purchased from the Home Economics Department for \$10.</p>	<p>Written work:</p> <p>There is written class and research work for both units, Textiles and Food. This work will be due during the semester.</p> <p>Practical lessons</p> <p>Food: students will cook regularly.</p> <p>Textiles: students will produce a cushion.</p>
