ENGLISH	Me, Myself & Others – Students will study a variety of texts exploring personal and public worlds and roles within it. Their main prescribed text will be a film study – <i>Spirited Away</i> .	Weebly 25%

Students will be given the opportunity to design, experiment and test basic Engineering principles in the construction of a Bottle Car Racer.
