Uniform


As we are heading into winter, we would like to remind parents of the procedure around uniform. Students are to obtain a note from home, outlining the reason they are out of uniform and for how long. They are then to take the note to the front office where they will receive a green uniform slip that they must show to teachers at the beginning of each lesson to avoid being marked out of uniform. Multiple uniform infringements can result in detentions being issued, so please ensure that your child follows the correct procedures. Remember that students can now purchase uniform from the canteen any day of the week.

Thursday Sport

It is important for growth and development that students undertake a sport in Year 8. This year, students have been placed into Grade Sport or Recreational sport which means they either participate in a competition where they play against other schools or they participate in a sporting activity like ice skating or bushwalking. TECHNOLOGY – Industrial Arts	Year 8 Technology (Industrial Arts) will be continuing the design and construction of their highly creative timber and 3D printed mechanical toys (Cam Toy). Students will document their process in their design folio and apply their critical reflection skills to the final products. At the beginning of week 8 all Technology Mandatory classes will rotate and start their new area of study in either Industrial Arts or Home Economics.	Cam Toy completion and design folio submission.
TECHNOLOGY MANDATORY— Home Economics	At the beginning of week 8 all Technology Mandatory classes will rotate and start their new area of study in either Home Economics or Industrial Arts. Half of all Year 8 classes will be studying Technology Mandatory with the Home Economics faculty in Semester 1. Those students will be completing two units of work over the semester on Food and Agriculture and Materials (Textiles). Food and Agriculture focuses on the theme of 'Food Trucks'. In the Food and Agriculture area students will develop and complete a product that is sold from a Food Truck. The dish is to be healthy and suitable for a specific group in the community. Students will research healthy foods and healthy cooking methods as well as looking at ethics in food and food security.
